Deaf & Hard of Hearing Services

(Services Provided State-Wide)

Many individuals who are Deaf or Hard of Hearing and need to access mental health services face obstacles to getting the care they need.

The good news is that the GNMH Deaf Services team, a group of Deaf and hearing professionals who are fluent in American Sign Language, are able to provide mental health and/or substance use disorder services statewide. The team understands the challenges related to deafness and hearing loss.

Our services are available for adults, children and families, including hearing children of Deaf parents, and hearing parents of Deaf children, and include:

- Individual, family and group therapy
- Psychiatric evaluation and medication management for current clients as appropriate
- Interpreters for appointments with non-signing GNMH providers.
- Functional support services and case management in the community


Adults & Older Adult Services

This innovative program is for adolescents and young adults (ages 12-18) and their families. The Seven Challenges® program builds an environment of mutual respect where individuals can talk openly and honestly about themselves, engage in actively thinking about their use of alcohol or other drugs and its affect upon their lives. This approach to recovery also addresses "co-occurring" mental health disorders, such as depression, anxiety or a history of trauma.

If you or someone you know is struggling with a substance use disorder, we are here to help.

We offer an array of outpatient services including:

- Assessment and evaluation by professionals trained in substance use disorders
- Individual and family therapy
- Peer recovery support and case management
- Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP)
- Outpatient group therapy
- Medication Assisted Therapy (MAT)
- Drug Court program, to break the cycle of criminal involvement through treatment and effective rehabilitation services

Our H.O.P.E Program

For individuals 15-35 years of age

H.O.P.E, which stands for "helping overcome psychosis early," is an early intervention approach for young individuals between the age of 15-35 who experience a first episode of psychosis.

The key to this program is effective and early intervention. There is a common misconception that often labels individuals with schizophrenia as hopeless. The reality is that there is HOPE, and with coordinated specialty care and treatment, individuals can work toward recovery.
